What challenges face vulnerable groups when accessing the labour market?

Each seventh of us lives with temporary or long-term disability (WHO 2022)

Afghanistan



- 1. Disability prevalence 14%
- 2. 50% higher in rural areas
- 3. 80% of adults live with some form of disability
- 4. Two types: mujahideens vs. natural (polio, explosions, accidents)
- Perception/acceptance; payments
- Death sentence if rural area



TAJIKISTAN



Definitions

- International Classification of Functioning, Disability and Health (ICF) - result of interactions between an individual and environment (18% by WB)
- 2. Tjk definition based on workability and functioning of individuals (2% by government)

Statistics



JICA - Working Paper to Support the National Action Plan for the Preparation of the Republic of Tajikistan for Ratification and Implementation of the Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities

- 1. Disability prevalence 16% (20% among 18+)
- 2. 3pp higher in urban areas
- 3. Use healthcare facilities more often than people without difficulties
- 4. Average disability pension 1/5 of an average salary
- 5. Among the PwDs 18+:
 - 10 percent point less frequent married status
 - Twice as likely to report not receiving outpatient care when needed
 - Less access to printed media, television and radio, computer devices, and internet

Labour market - drivers



- 1. Universal access to decent work is a basic human right
- 2. No. growing 1.5% annually (esp. among children)
- Almost three times as likely to report never attending formal education (esp. girls)
- Urban Planning Code urban planning should ensure unhindered access to social and other facilities for PwDs
- 5. Risk to die much earlier (up to 20 years earlier)

Labour market – barriers



- Misconception (incl. stigmatisation since kindergartens parents, teachers, service providers, PwDs themselves)
- Staff shortage (quality vs. quantity)
- Physical accessibility/transport barriers improved but corrupted
- Financial shortage
- Information shortage
- Shortage of assistive devices/specialist services
- Soviet-relict institutional care
- Massive role of 111 CSOs

TJK – Employment



- 1. More likely to report having prior work experience (61 vs. 54%) ableded migrate to the Commonwealth (25%)?
- 2. Mostly (80%) in public sector
- 3. Key male barrier education
- 4. Key female barrier childcare

TJK - Participation & support ■

The Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (CRPD) necessitates "the right of persons with disabilities to work on an equal basis with others; this includes the right to the opportunity to gain a living by work freely chosen or accepted in a labour market and work environment that is open, inclusive and accessible to persons with disabilities".

- 1. Overall labour participation rate 41% (2021) ↓
- The Agency for Labour and Employment of the Population
 - the local branches support PwDs with selfemployment, micro-credits for entrepreneurial initiatives and vocational training offerings
 - employment promotion programmes for PwD registration as unemployed for unemployment benefits, support for self-employment, temporary employment through public works, vocational training for jobless, employment through job quotas and tax incentives for employers

TJK - Recommendations■

- Inclusive data surveys, databases, administration
- Strengthen more cross-sectoral approach
- 3. Build general public's awareness of rights (incl. to work) and abilities of PwDs
- 4. Create so-called Single Window Services
