
### Home Funds legal bases 2021–2027

Internal policy instruments

Fund	Specific Objectives	
Asylum, Migration and Integration Fund (AMIF)	Common European Asylum System – Legal migration and Integration – Return and Readmission – Solidarity	
Border Management and Visa Instrument (BMVI)	Border management at the external borders – Common visa policy	
Internal Security Fund (ISF)	Exchange of information – Cross-border cooperation – Member States' capabilities to prevent/combat crime	




### Total 2021-2027 HOME Affairs Support (EUR billion)

### AMIF - Objectives and minimum allocations

SO1 – Strengthen & develop all aspects of the Common European Asylum System (min.15% of MS programmes);

SO2 - Strengthen & develop legal migration to MSs, promote integration and social inclusion of third country national (min.15% of MS programmes);

SO3 - Counter irregular migration & enhancing effective, safe & dignified return and readmission (incl. reintegration in TCs);

SO4 - Enhance solidarity and fair sharing of responsibility between MSs (min. 20% of the Thematic Facility).

NB: min 5% Thematic Facility allocations for Local/Regional Authorities in integration

### AMIF – Scope of support (Examples)

**SO1** • Capacity building for Asylum Procedures • Reception services (e.g. legal and interpretation services) • Specialised support for vulnerable persons, unaccompanied minors and victims of trafficking (e.g. family tracing, psychosocial support, rehabilitation services).

SO3 • Return measures • Alternatives to detention • Community based case management • Complaint and redress mechanisms for third country nationals against those who illegally employ them • Reintegration assistance • Support in third countries for temporary accommodation and reception

**SO2** • Integration strategies • Assistance to third country nationals (language learning, orientation courses, information sessions, assistance with family reunification and legal status, one-stop integration shops etc.)

SO4 •Resettlement and humanitarian admission • Transfers (relocation) of beneficiaries/applicants of international protection • Solidarity measures with other Member States (exchange of experts, logistical support, etc.)

### Member States Programmes

- Information on the programme publicly available (website) within 6 months from programme's approval.
- Information on programme's calls (incl. timetable) publicly available (website).
- List of operations selected for support by the Funds and respective beneficiaries <u>publicly available</u> (website). Beneficiaries to be made aware of transparency requirements.
- Communication and visibility material, including at the level of beneficiaries, to be made available upon request to Union institutions, bodies, offices or agencies.



# Partnership principle in Member State Programming

- The Member States have a **legal obligation** to organise and implement a **comprehensive partnership** including, among others, relevant bodies representing civil society, non-governmental organisations, and bodies responsible for promoting social inclusion, fundamental rights, rights of persons with disabilities, gender equality and non-discrimination
- Partners to be involved in all phases of programming, implementation and evaluation of the programmes



### Programmes' Mid-Term Review (MTR)

- By Fund and by programme
- Subject to minimum implementation levels.
- Amounts reserved for the Member States not reaching the required implementation level will be allocated to the **Thematic Facility**
- Criteria for the allocation of funding to eligible programmes are preestablished
- Eligible programmes will receive the MTR allocations at the beginning of 2025 (split over 2025, 2026 and 2027)



### MFF Mid-Term Revision

- ➤ Additional allocations of **EUR 810M** for AMIF for Pact Implementation purposes + support to MS hosting people fleeing the war in Ukraine
- Will be added to AMIF thematic facility and may then be channelled to the Member States programmes
- Links with Common and National Implementation Plans for preparing for the Pact implementation
- Prioritisation and concentration of funds: adequate capacity for carrying out the border procedure, legal counselling, asylum and reception systems
- Process will be aligned with the MTR of the Member States AMIF programmes

### Thematic Facility - Union actions

- Union actions: transnational projects or projects of particular interest to the EU implemented in accordance with the objectives of the Fund. These projects often underpin or develop new strategies and methodologies, or they build networks and partnerships between actors in different Member States (for instance in the area of integration);
  - > They are established by the annual work programme
  - ➤ They are implemented directly by the Commission, or indirectly with pillar assessed partners (mostly international organisations)
  - They are implemented through open Calls for proposals, direct awards, contribution agreements or tenders



### The AMIF-2025 Integration call

Publication foreseen in end March 2025

#### Priorities to be included:

- Support measures for migrant women's integration
- Access to healthcare
- Improving digital skills among migrants
- Promoting complementary pathways linked to education
- Transnational actions to support Member States in the field of protection of children in migration



### Applying to DG HOME Calls for proposals

### WHEN to apply?

- Main Integration call to be published in end March
- Follow the Funding and tenders portal regularly
- A minimum of 4 months between publication and submission

### **HOW** to apply?

- Proposals are submitted electronically through the Funding and tender page
- You need to register on the Participant Register and have an EU login

### Applying to DG HOME Calls for proposals

### Further considerations

Limited funding + high number of request = **Strong competition** 

- Participate in the Info sessions
- Check the FAQ for additional clarifications
- Pay particular attention to all aspects of the application including eligibility; <u>ALWAYS</u> check in the call type of applicants allowed for each topic! One ineligible partner rejects the entire proposal;
- Make your proposal as targeted as possible to the topic relevance is fundamental!
- Take into account all award criteria they are mentioned in the Call text with their weighting



### Applying to DG HOME Calls for proposals

- Involving applicants from more Member States than the minimum number identified;
- With broad geographical scope from diverse regions across the EU;
- Involving key actors, such as public authorities (local, regional and/or national), economic and social partners, civil society organisations, employers, service providers in the relevant areas;
- With specific attention to migrant women and children, and to members of religious or ethnic minority who could face discrimination; This year special focus on youth;
